

## **PUBLICATION ETHICS AND PUBLICATION MALPRACTICE STATEMENT FOR REGION, ENTREPRENEURSHIP, DEVELOPMENT (RED) SCIENTIFIC CONFERENCE**

The Region, Entrepreneurship, Development (RED) Scientific Conference is committed to high standards of academic publishing and therefore expects all contributors (Organizing and Programme committee, researchers, authors, reviewers, publishers) to follow the principles set by the Committee on Publication Ethics (COPE): Guidelines on Good Publication Practice, with particular emphasis on:

- Reliability in all aspects of research,
- Accountability for the research,
- Honesty in developing, reviewing, and communicating research.

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Authorship should be limited to individuals who have made significant intellectual contributions to the conception, design, execution, or interpretation of the research and to the writing of the manuscript.

The corresponding author is responsible for ensuring that:

- all appropriate co-authors are included
- all co-authors have reviewed and approved the manuscript prior to submission

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## Disclosure and conflicts of interest

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Authors should explicitly acknowledge use of large language models (LLMs). In their acknowledgment, they should describe how and for what part of the article the tools were used. If the use of generative AI is revealed after the article has been submitted, the Organizing Committee will reject the article without possibility for corrections.

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
